

Add the UCumberlands Library to your Google Scholar Searches

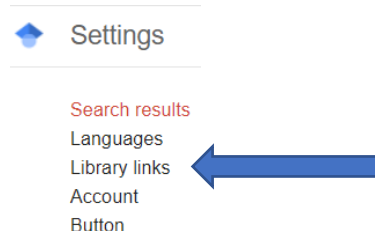
Google Scholar is a crawler search engine that filters for scholarly sources across databases and meta databases and allows you to narrow source selection by year. It also includes citation management for sources and article ranking. Google Scholar can be a vital component to any literature review sourcing strategies in addition to the university library.

Now it is possible to link the UCumberlands Library directly to your Google Scholar account.

1. Once you are logged into your Google account, go to Google Scholar and click on the three bars in the upper left of your browser



2. Then click on Settings and then Library Links



3. Search for the University of the Cumberland in the search bar and then check the box to add **ViewNow@MyUC** to your library links.

4. Then click Save and search away. When a source is available in the UC Library, you will see the **ViewNow@MyUC** link to the right of the source description.

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5. Click on the **ViewNow@MyUC** link and be taken directly into the source in the UC Library.
